

General data privacy statement

Data privacy statement for cookies

Our website utilises cookies. These are small text files that enable to save specific informations related to the user on his computer while he is using the website. Cookies enable to identify especially the frequency of utilisation and the number of viewed pages, to analyse the user behaviour with regard to the utilisation of the site but also to make our website more customer-friendly. Cookies will remain saved until you close the browser and can be saved anew when you visit the website one more time. Data privacy statement for Google Analytics

Our website uses Google Analytics, a web analysis service from Google Inc., 1600 Amphitheatre Parkway, Mountain View, CA 94043, USA. To deactivate Google Analytics, Google provides a browser plug-in on <http://tools.google.com/dlpage/gaoptout?hl=de>. Google Analytics uses cookies. These are small text files that enable to save specific informations related to the user on his computer while he is using the website. These cookies enable to record the informations regarding the utilisation of the website that will be analysed by Google. The informations recorded through the cookies (including your IP address) will normally be transmitted to and saved on an US server from Google. We would like to point out that on this website Google Analytics has been extended to the code „gat._anonymizeIp();“ to ensure an anonymised recording of IP addresses (so-called IP masking).
